Before this bridge route was opened, cycling to Kukup requires a detour to Pekan Nanas, a little town that is up North away from the direction to Kukup. The new route was a joy to ride. It provides shorter access to Kukup with great scenic view and light vehicular traffic.

We all arrived Kukup in good time and all ready to enjoy the hospitality, facilities and meals offered by the chalet operator. From a casual walk in the village and chitchats with the village locals, we also caught a glimpse of the changes in Kukup – development of properties for tourism and the transformation of Kukup from a fishing village to fish farming.
