RULES & REGULATIONS

1 RULES OF THE GAME

- 1.1 The competition shall be conducted in accordance with the existing rules of the game as approved by the World Standardised Rules set by the World Pool Association and the Rules of the Public Service STAR Games.

2 ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 The Competition is open to all civil servants and officers serving in Statutory Boards, Restructured Hospitals and Government-Aided Schools.
- 2.2 The following personnel are not eligible to participate in the competition:
- a) Players who have represented Singapore (including reserves) in SEA Games, Asian Games, Commonwealth Games or Olympic Games during the current year and past two years;

- b) Players who earn their living as professional players for Clubs, etc during the current and past two years;
 - c) Current registered Singapore League club players; and
 - d) Full-time National Servicemen.
- 2.3 Convenors and team managers are responsible to ensure that only eligible players are registered for the competition.

3 ENTRY AND REGISTRATION OF PLAYERS

- 3.1 Each team can submit up to 8 players.
- 3.2 There shall be no substitutions or additions of players after the commencement of the first tie.
- 3.3 Organisation with two teams or more in the competition is not allowed to switch their players among teams. A player can only play for one team.
- 3.4 A team can comprise players from other agencies.

4 COMPETITION MATCH FORMAT

- 4.1 The competition will run on a Double Elimination format.
Knockout rounds starts from Quarter finals
- 4.2 Each match shall be decided on the best of 5 games.
- 4.3 In any match, once a result has been established, the dead rubber will play one rack sudden death for both 8 ball and 9 ball.

5 COMPETITION RULES

- 5.1 **Submission of Line-up:** The line-up for each match shall be submitted to the tournament official at least 15 minutes before the scheduled time of play. No substitutions are allowed after the submission of the line-up.
- 5.2 **The Match-up:** Each match shall consist of 5 games to be played by 5 different players.
- 5.3 **Order of Play:** Each match shall be completed in the following order:

1st game	-	9-ball Open Single	Race to 5 Racks
2nd game	-	8-ball Female Single	Race to 3 Racks
3rd game	-	8-ball Open Single	Race to 3 Racks

4th game	-	9-ball Open Single	Race to 5 Racks
5th game	-	8-ball Open Single	Race to 3 Racks

5.4 The order of play cannot be changed.

5.5 Women is allowed to play in Men's game, but not vice versa.

6 DRAW

6.1 The system of draw shall be as follow:

- a) The top four teams of last year's competition shall seeded and placed into different groups. The placing of the four teams shall be pre-determined by the Organiser.
- b) For agencies with more than one team, the teams from the same agency shall be drawn into different grouping first.
- c) After completion of (b), the rest of the teams shall then be drawn into the different groups.

7 WALKOVER

7.1 At least 3 players must be present at the scheduled starting time, else the opposing team will be awarded a walkover. During the competition, once a pair of players has completed their match, the next scheduled pair must be ready for play. If a player is not ready or present to play after a grace period of 5 minutes, his opponent will receive a walkover for that match. This match will deem to be over and another pair must be ready to play. The same principle will apply if any player is not ready or present to play.

8 REFEREES AND SCORERS

8.1 Each team shall provide a referee and an assistant referee on each day of play.

8.2 During the final, there shall be an exchange of referees between the teams.

9 9 BALL RULES (REVISED RULING - THE THREE POINT BREAK RULE)

9.1 On the break shot, a minimum of three object balls must either be pocketed, or touch the head string line, or a combination of both. For example, if one object ball is pocketed, then at least two object balls must touch the head string line; or if two object balls are pocketed, then at least one object ball must touch the head string

line. (To touch the head string line means that the edge of the object ball must reach (break) the string line.)

- 9.2 If a player fails to meet the requirements in (9.1), but otherwise makes a legal break, the incoming player has the choice to accept the tables as is, or hand the shot back to his opponent.
- 9.3 In accepting the table as is, the incoming player is not permitted to play a “push-out”, he must play a legal shot to the ball on.
- 9.4 If the table is handed back to the breaker, the breaker is permitted to play a push-out. If so, his opponent will then have the choice to either play the shot, or hand it back.
- 9.5 If a player fails to meet the requirements of (9.1), but otherwise makes a legal break and pockets the 9 ball, the 9 ball is reposted before the next shot is played.

10 ATTIRE

- 10.1 Player must wear collared shirt or Polo T-shirt, with sleeves. Shoes must be covered and no shorts are allowed. Player who is not properly attired may not be allowed to enter the competition hall.

11 PHOTOGRAPHY

- 11.1 The Civil Service Club and Cuesports Singapore reserve the right to use any photographs (including those of Participants), motion pictures, recordings, or any other media records of any STAR Games, for any legitimate purpose, including commercial advertising and distribution to sponsors and partners.
- 11.2 Photography and/or videography will be taken during the event for news and publicity purposes by the official photographer and/or videographer and may be used for print and on online/electronic platforms of the Civil Service Club and any media platform of Cuesports Singapore. The Organiser owns all rights to the photographs and video recordings. Any participants who do not wish to have their photographs or video recordings taken can notify inform the Organiser at the event site.

- 12.1 All participants consent to their personal data being collected and processed for purposes of administration and communication in a particular event. Participants also agree to receive postings on other events organised by the Civil Service Club.
