RULES & REGULATIONS

1 TOURNAMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1.1 The tournament shall be conducted in accordance with the FIFA Futsal Laws of the Game (Indoor Pitch) except as amended by the organiser, STAR Games General Rules and the following Tournament rules.
- 1.2 Team managers and captains must ensure that all their matches are played in the spirit of the game as provided in the rules.

2 TOURNAMENT DIVISIONS

- 2.1 The Tournament shall comprise the following two divisions and category:
 - a) Men's Division I
 - b) Men's Division II
 - c) Women's Category
- 2.2 The Men's Division I and II are Championship STAR Games subject to a minimum of eight (8) participating agencies.
- 2.4 Division I agencies are strictly not allowed to compete in Division II. Division II agencies can opt to compete in Division I. The two Divisions shall be merged into one if either Division has less than six (6) participating agencies.

- 2.5 A minimum of six (6) participating agencies is needed for the Women's Category to proceed.

3 ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1 The Tournament is open to all civil servants and officers serving in Statutory Boards, Restructured Hospitals and Government-Aided Schools, and invited former Statutory Boards.

- 3.2 The following personnel shall not be eligible to participate in the Tournament:

- a) Public Officers who have represented Singapore (including those as Reserves) in SEA Games, Asian Games, Commonwealth Games or Olympic Games during the current year and past two years,
- b) Players who earn their living as professional players for Clubs, etc during the current and past two years, and
- c) Full-time National Servicemen.

(Other than the four Major Games mentioned in (a), players who are selected by their NSAs to play in other international competitions (whether overseas or local) will not be deemed as National Players, and hence will be eligible to participate in the STAR Games).

- 3.3 Teams competing in the Men's Division I and II must comprise staff of the participating agencies.
- 3.4 Teams competing in the Women's Category, are allowed to register players from other agencies. Team Managers of mixed-agency teams must ensure that all the team members are eligible players as defined in the STAR Games General Rules.
- 3.5 Only registered players are allowed to participate in the tournament. Any participating team found fielding non-registered players shall be disqualified from the tournament.

4 REGISTRATION OF TEAMS

- 4.1 Sports Liaison Officers can register their teams online at www.csc.sg/stargames . All registrations must be accompanied by online payment of registration fees otherwise it will be voided. Registration fees are strictly non-refundable.
- 4.2 Each team is allowed to register a maximum of 10 players and a minimum of 5 players.
- 4.3 Team manager must submit a team sheet with the players' name and jersey number to the match officials before kick-off. Once the match has commenced, no changes will be allowed on the team sheet.

5 TOURNAMENT FORMAT

- 5.1 The tournament shall be played on a **Group League/Knock-Out** system. The winner of each group will advance to the Knock-Out round.
- 5.2 For the Women's Category, the top 2 teams from each group shall proceed to the knock-out round.

6 DURATION OF THE GAME

- 6.1 The duration of play for each match shall be 15 minutes flat with no half-time change over.

7 REFEREE

- 7.1 All matches shall be refereed by a certified referee. The referee's decision on the match shall be final. No appeal against his decision shall be entertained.

8 POINT SYSTEM & TIE-BREAKER FOR LEAGUE SYSTEM

- 8.1 In the group system, three points shall be awarded for a win and one point for a draw.
- 8.2 In the event that two or more teams tie on points, the following system shall apply to break a tie:
 - a) Head-to-Head
 - b) Goal Difference
 - c) Goals Scored
 - d) Sudden Death Penalty or Coin Toss

9 KNOCK-OUT COMPETITION

- 9.1 In the event of a draw, no extra time will be played. Penalty kicks will decide the winner.
- 9.2 The following conditions shall apply:
 - a) The referee shall choose the goal at which the kicks shall be taken.
 - b) He shall toss a coin to decide which team to take the first kick.
 - c) Three players from each team shall alternately take the penalty kicks. The team captains of the respective teams shall inform the main referee of the names of their three players who are taking the kicks before the penalty kicks are taken. The players taking the kicks must be on the court of play and among those 10 players registered in the line-up form submitted before the match.

- d) If there is no clear winner after the 3 penalty kicks by both teams, it will be followed by a sudden death penalty kick.
- e) Any eligible player may change place with his goalkeeper.
- f) During the penalty shoot-out, all players shall remain on the other side of the court to which the penalty kicks are taken.

10 WITHDRAWAL/WALKOVER

- 10.1 An agency that withdraws or gives a walkover after the fixtures of the tournament had been drawn shall be fined \$100.
- 10.2 No grace time will be given. A team that fails to field a minimum of 5 players will deem to have given a walkover. A 3-0 scoreline will be awarded to the opposing team.

11 REPORTING TIME

- 11.1 All players are required to report at the venue of competition 45 minutes before the time scheduled for their matches.

12 JERSEY COLOURS

- 12.1 Players of each team shall wear numbered jerseys of the same colour. If the jersey colours of the two opposing teams clash, the team first named in the fixtures shall change their jerseys to another colour.
- 12.2 Goalkeeper must put on jersey of different colour bearing his registered number. He shall wear colour that can easily distinguish him from the other players and the referees.

13 TOURNAMENT BALLS

- 13.1 Size 4 Futsal ball will be provided.

14 FOOTWEAR

- 14.1 All players must wear long socks, appropriate shoes and shin guards. Shin guards is compulsory.

15 VERIFICATION

- 15.1 All participants are to bring along their NRIC or Employment/Office passes for verification by the Tournament Official if required.

16 PRIZES

- 16.1 Medals shall be awarded to the top 4 teams of each category.
- 16.2 Cash prizes will be awarded to the top 4 teams in Men's Division I as follows:
- a) Champion - 10 medals plus \$350 and Champion Trophy
 - b) 1st Runner-up - 10 medals plus \$300
 - c) 2nd Runner-up - 10 medals plus \$250
 - d) 3rd Runner-up - 10 medals plus \$200
- 16.3 No cash prizes shall be awarded for Men's Division II and the Women's Category.

17 **PROTEST**

- 17.1 A protest must be submitted by the team manager, using the official protest form together with a deposit of \$50, to the referee/tournament official.
- 17.2 Any protest concerning results and standings must be submitted to the tournament official within 15 minutes from the time the results are announced, posted or displayed at the event. Protest on other matters such as players' eligibility, technical decisions, misconduct, etc., must be submitted within half an hour after the match or event.
- 17.3 The deposit of \$50 will be refunded if a protest is upheld, otherwise it shall be forfeited.
- 17.4 The decision of the Protest Committee is final and there shall be no appeal.

18 **CAUTIONS/SENT-OFF**

- 18.1 A player who receives two (2) yellow cards shall be suspended for the next match.
- a) Two yellow cards - Suspension: 1 match
 - b) Subsequent yellow card - Suspension: 1 match
- 18.2 A player who receives a red card shall be expelled from the field of play and suspended for the next match.
- a) 1st red card - Suspension: 1 match
 - b) 2nd red card - Disqualified from tournament

19 SUBSTITUTION

- 19.1 The number of “flying” substitutions during a match is unlimited, except in the case of the goalkeeper, who can only be replaced when the ball is not in play. A player who has been replaced may return to the pitch as a substitute for another player.
- 19.2 A “flying” substitutions is one which is made when the ball is still in play.

20 INDEMNITY

- 20.1 The Civil Service Club, the Tournament Committee and appointed officials or staff shall not be liable for any loss of personal property and injury or death whatsoever caused to any player or official during or as a result of his or her participation, in the Tournament.

21 OTHERS

- 21.1 The team manager and coach are responsible for the proper control and good conduct of their players and supporters. All teams are urged to play in the spirit of fair play and sportsmanship.
- 21.2 Any rule which are not provided for in these Rules & Regulations in the conduct of the tournament shall be decided by the Tournament Committee whose decision shall be final.

22 PHOTOGRAPHY

- 22.1 The Civil Service Club reserves the right to use any photographs (including those of Participants), motion pictures, recordings, or any other media records of any STAR Games, for any legitimate purpose, including commercial advertising and distribution to sponsors and partners.
- 22.2 Photography and/or videography will be taken during the event for news and publicity purposes by the official photographer and/or videographer, and may be used for print and on online/electronic platforms of the Civil Service Club. The Organiser owns all rights to the photographs and video recordings. Any participants who do not wish to have their photographs or video recordings taken can notify the Organiser at the event site.

23 PERSONAL DATA PROTECTION

- 23.1 All participants consent to their personal data being collected and processed for purposes of administration and communication in a particular event. Participants also agree to receive postings on other events organised by the Civil Service Club.

DISCLAIMER

The Civil Service Club reserves the right to cancel, postpone or change the venue, date and/or time of the competition at its discretion due to inclement weather, facility problem or any other situation deemed as appropriate.

The Civil Service Club and its servants and/or agents will not be held responsible for any claims arising out of any death or injury, damage or loss, suffered or caused while attending this competition, and this includes all costs and expenses incurred as a result of such claims.
