RULES & REGULATIONS

1 RULES OF THE GAME

1.1 The Archery Challenge shall be conducted in accordance with the Rules of Archery Association of Singapore except as amended by the organiser, STAR Games General Rules and the following Tournament rules.

3 ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1 The Archery Challenge is open to all civil servants and officers serving in Statutory Boards, Restructured Hospitals and Government-Aided Schools, and invited former Statutory Boards.
- 3.2 The following personnel shall not be eligible to participate in the Tournament:
 - a) Public Officers who have represented Singapore (including those as Reserves) in SEA Games, Asian Games, Commonwealth Games or Olympic Games during the current year and past two years,
 - b) Players who earn their living as professional players for Clubs, etc during the current and past two years, and
 - c) Full-time National Servicemen.

(Other than the four Major Games mentioned in (a), players who are selected by their NSAs to play in other international competitions (whether overseas or local) will not be deemed as National Players, and hence will be eligible to participate in the STAR Games).

3.3 All participants are required to bring along their Employment/ Staff passes for verification by the Tournament Official if required.

4 REGISTRATION OF TEAMS

- 4.1 Sports Liaison Officers can register their teams online at www.csc.sg/stargames. All registrations must be accompanied by online payment of registration fees otherwise it will be voided. Registration fees are strictly non-refundable.
- 4.2 Each team shall register 3 archers regardless of gender.
- 4.3 An agency is allowed to register archers from other government agencies. The agency registering the mixed-agency team must ensure that all the team members are eligible archers.
- 4.4 An archer is allowed to play for one agency only. Multiple representation of agencies by an archer is strictly not allowed.
- 4.5 Any changes to the online registration details of players must be made three days before the start of the Tournament. No changes shall be allowed on commencement of the Challenge unless there are valid reasons to do so. An archer who has left the government service on the day of play shall not be eligible to participate and no replacement is allowed.
- 4.6 A minimum of six (6) participating agencies is required for the Challenge to proceed.

5 ARCHER PROFICIENCY

- 5.1 Teams / participants new to the sport must attend 2 compulsory training sessions of 2 hours per session on 3 and 24 May 2025 at own cost.
- 5.2 Participants must be physically fit to stand and comfortably shoot a standard bow set.

6 FORMAT

- 6.1 Each team shall comprise 3 archers of any gender.
- 6.2 The distance of the target is 18 metres. The target is 40cm 10-ring Target Face
- 6.3 The format for the tournament 1 round of qualification round. The top 8 teams shall proceed to the next round (second round) for a knock-out competition.

- 6.4 The qualification round shall consist of 10 ends of 3 arrows each, each end shall be 90 seconds. A total of 10 ends shall be shot, for a total of 30 arrows.
- 6.5 The team elimination shall consist of head-to-head matches between the Top 8 teams as determined by the total scores of the team members during the qualification round. Should there be less than 8 teams, the higher-ranking teams may receive a bye in the first round.
- 6.6 The team elimination matches shall consist of 6 arrows each set, with each member shooting 2 arrows. Each set shall be 120 seconds. A total of 4 sets may be shot per match.
- 6.7 The team with the highest score for the set shall win the set. Winner of each set shall be awarded 2 set points. In the event of a tie, each team shall receive 1 set point.
- 6.8 The team who reaches 5 set points shall be the winner of that match.
- 6.9 Should a match end with 4 set points each, the match will go into a shoot-off as follows:
 - a) A shoot-off shall consist of 3 arrows, with each member shooting 1 arrow, the shoot-off shall be 60 seconds.
 - b) The team with the highest score for the 3 arrows shall be the winner.
 - c) Should the scores be tied in the shoot-off, the team with an arrow closest to the centre of a scoring face shall be declared the winner.
 - d) Should the placing of the arrow be too close to be determined by the Judge, a second shoot-off may be conducted.

7 ATTIRE AND EQUIPMENT

- 7.1 Archers of each team must wear jerseys of the same colour.
- 7.2 Archers shall use archery equipment as provided.
- 7.3 Archers may use their own personal equipment, including finger-tab, arm guard, finger sling, and quiver.

8 **PRIZES**

8.1 Cash prizes will be awarded to the top 4 teams as follows:

> a) Champion 3 medals plus \$350 and

Champion Trophy

b) 1st Runner-up c) 2nd Runner-up d) 3rd Runner-up -3 medals plus \$300 3 medals plus \$250 3 medals plus \$200

9 PHOTOGRAPHY

- 9.1 The Civil Service Club reserves the right to use any photographs (including those of Participants), motion pictures, recordings, or any other media records of any STAR Games, for any legitimate purpose, including commercial advertising and distribution to sponsors and partners.

The Organiser owns all rights to the photographs and video recordings. Any participants who do not wish to have their photographs or video recordings taken can notify inform the Organiser at the event site.

10.1 All participants consent to their personal data being collected and processed for purposes of administration and communication in a particular event. Participants also agree to receive postings on other events organised by the Civil Service Club.

- 11.1 All participating agencies and teams must comply with prevailing COVID-19 Safe Management Measures (SMMs) by Ministry of Health and Sport Singapore.
- 11.2 Team members must not show up at the event venue if feeling unwell or exhibit any symptoms of Covid-19 infection
